 - Experience dark skies, bat detecting and night time orienteering

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Some of the adventurous activities, enquiries and experiences we offer:



• <u>Morning help</u> - each morning your class will help around the farm for half an hour, collecting eggs, emptying the compost, filling the bird feeders, bottle feeding the lambs, and setting the table for breakfast and then becoming waiters delivering the food to the tables.

• Land Art - How to capture the beauty of nature through art. Working as artists we have a wealth on our palette to create a wide range of art. We explore making paint, felt, craft hedgerow jewellery, dye with leaves, design rangolis, construct organic sculptures, press leaf prints, sculpt faces with mud.

• <u>Learning and building together</u> - Our eight 20 minute team building challenges enable children to develop communication, leadership & listening skills. Whether tackling 'The Mago Egg', 'Tyred Out' or 'Flat pack frenzee', your class will experience & hopefully develop the skills needed to work together

• <u>Famers in training</u>-Where does are food come from and why is farming so important? 'Become a farmer for a day'. We will make hurdle fences, feed animals, create scarecrows, muck out, grind corn and make flour then bread for supper, churn butter and finally sow seeds before completing a taste tour of the veg patch!

• <u>Darwin Day</u> - *How many mini beast are there at Naturesbase?* Working as scientists we explore the woodland, hedgerows, meadows and stream habitats and introduce the idea of sampling, averaging and extrapolation to work out the number of creatures that share the farm with us.

• <u>Celtic adventure to the sea</u>*- map in hand we head down the valley to the secret garden. We picnic by the river before exploring a historic mansion house illustrating how the household lived in the 1840's. Our journey ends in Aberaeron where we crab fish, build theme parks for crabs on the beach and eat honey ice cream.

• <u>Ancient Britons & Celts</u>- *How did the lives on ancient Briton change during Stone Age?* In tribes, we will hand round & discuss artefacts to help us learn about life in the Stone Age. Then we will build shelters next to the stream, light fires with a spark, boil dragon vomit, make nettle pancakes, & make pots with river bank clay.

• <u>Celtic ponderings</u> - *How do artifacts & art help us understand the lives of the Celtic Iron Age?* Through a series of carousel activities children will have the opportunity to create hedgerow jewellery, learn to felt with wool form our sheep, weave hurdles and daub mud, make runes and make soap with herbs & flowers.

• <u>The ultimate nomadic mountain challenge - suitable for yr 5 & 6*</u> The wilderness of Cambrian mountains offer a great days adventure We will navigate our way by a stream leading to the lakes, immerse ourselves in this wild landscape, write a poem & have lunch in a mountain bothy.

• <u>Village Detective</u> - There is an unsolved mystery in the village. Children are challenged to use a map, answer the clues & solve the mystery. This engaging activity provides opportunities to explore a welsh speaking village, compare & contrast with the home environment and develop a sense of place.

• <u>Weather detectives</u> - *How & why does the micro climate change ?* - Using a variety of simple weather instruments we will work as meteorologist learning about how and why climate change in different places & over time.

• <u>Sustainability</u> - *How can we live more sustainably*? - with solar panels, biofuel boilers, straw bale buildings, earth structures, extensive composting & food growing areas, Naturesbase offers a unique opportunity for children to learn about sustainability & make & bake in a solar oven.

- <u>Rivers & Stream</u>- *Why does my river flood each year*? We 'll make the rivers flow on our huge river model before following the our stream from its source to where it joins the river Aeron recording changes & measurements as we go.
- <u>Evening activities</u> Outdoor Pizza Making Orienteering, campfires & singing, bat detectives , wildlife challenge, story telling, quiz and eco drama.

You, as the school's party leader, can choose from over 40 outdoor pursuits, adventurous activities, tasks, games and projects. We will work with you to create an individual programme to suit your group. * An additional coach cost is required for this activity
